

Samuel D. Miller III, Esq.

Attorney Samuel D. Miller is in private practice in Lansdale, Montgomery County, PA. His practice focuses on the representation of lawyers and law firms in matters before the Disciplinary Board and Lawyers' Fund for Client Security, and in other issues of attorney ethics and professional responsibility, as well as client relations, and practice management.

Attorney Miller was Disciplinary Counsel in the Office of Disciplinary Counsel of the Disciplinary Board of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania for over 29-years and was Disciplinary Counsel in Charge of the District II Office of that organization for 17½ of those years. He is a Past President and member of the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Bar Association ("PBA") Conference of County Bar Leaders (CCBL). He also is a Past President of both the Montgomery Bar Association and the Montgomery Bar Foundation. He was a member of the Executive Committee of the Montgomery Bar Association for seven years, a member of the Board of Directors of that association and was a member of the Board of Directors of the Montgomery Bar Foundation from 1994 to 2006. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania Bar Foundation and a Fellow of both the Pennsylvania (Life Fellow) and Montgomery Bar Foundations. He has been a member of the PBA House of Delegates since 1994, was the co-chair of the PBA Committee on Professionalism for 2001-02 and 2000-01, vice-chair of the PBA's Government Lawyers' Committee for two years, and vice-chair of the PBA Membership Development Committee for 2004-05. He was a founding member of the Board of Directors of the Montgomery Child Advocacy Project (2005). Outside the legal profession, he has served since 1985 as the Chair of the Upper Gwynedd Township (Montgomery County) Planning Commission and in 2006 served as a member of the Finance and Property Committee of the Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania. A retired Colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve, his last assignment was as the Deputy Inspector General for the United States Atlantic Command (now Joint Forces Command), Norfolk, VA.

Attorney Miller received his B.A. degree from Amherst College, Amherst, Massachusetts, and his J.D. from American University, Washington, DC. He has been a course planner, author and frequent lecturer statewide for the Pennsylvania Bar Institute, and for Pennsylvania Bar Association, county bar association and lawyers' professional liability insurance company MCLE programs on attorney ethics, professional responsibility, and malpractice avoidance and has been an expert witness in attorney malpractice cases.
